Iowa House Republicans Address Mental Health

Over the last few weeks I have addressed School Safety by voting for arming school staff and school infrastructure both of which are important and both of which the state house has passed over the last few months and sent to the Senate for passage. The last part of school safety that I haven't really discussed because it is the more difficult part is mental health. . Efforts have encompassed expanding access to mental health services for all ages, creating sustainable, long-term funding system, providing training to help schools address student mental health needs, and increasing mental health workforce throughout the state. The State spent a total of 1.1 billion dollars funding mental health last year through various programs across the state. The legislature also invested 41 million towards substance abuse, behavior health, psychiatry residency programs, mental health professional loan repayment programs and autism provider programs. Last

year the Legislature approved the following:

Mental Health Rate Increase: Provides a 13 million dollar increase in state funding for mental health and substance abuse Medicaid rates

Rural Emergency Hospitals: Establishes Licensure in Iowa for Rual Emergency Hospital designation. Mental Health Non-

Prohibits

noncompete agreements with mental health providers within the state.

Psychiatrist Public Fellowship: Provides a state funded psychiatry residency

program to include two

fellowships and 9 residents.

Psychologists Prescribing: removes the requirement that psychologists' complete certain requirements within 5 years of being issued a conditional prescription certificate.

Physician Assistant: repeals the requirement that physician assistants practice under the supervision of a physician and instead requires collaboration, including psychiatric PA's. This session the House Republicans have advanced the following 9 bills to address mental health in Iowa. These bills build on the work the legislature has done over the last 6 years to expand mental health care, increase workforce, increase Medicaid rates, create sustainable long-term funding of the mental health regions and provide an emphasis on children's mental health care. The list below includes the status of each bill as of March

Children's Mental Health: Provides for an enhanced rate for psychiatric medical institutions for children that care for children with specialized needs and make regulatory changes.

Access Center
Transportation: requires
DHHS to authorize payments to
ambulances transporting mental
health patients in crisis to an
access center at a similar
amount to when transporting to
an ER.

Social Work Compact: Establishes an interstate license for social workers after 7 states have joined the compact.

Direct Supervision and Licensure by Endorsement creates licensure by endorsement for licensed marital and family therapists and licensed mental health

counselors.

Behavioral Health System:
Overhauls the Behavioral
Health System so that its
purpose becomes prevention
early intervention, treatment
recovery support, and crisis
services for mental health
substance abuse, tobacco use
and problem gambling.

Social media for Minors: Requires parental permission for minors to access social media websites

These bills are part of a large effort that will improve Iowa's mental health system and at the same time be part of the third leg to keep our students safe in school. School safety has been a hot topic for me for years and I am proud to say that we are seeing some good movement towards making our kids safe this year.
